Ezekiel 36:26 invites us to focus in on the gift that the Spirit of God gives us as we every day can give up our burdens and fears to a God who invites us to a life of praise and abundance. I pray this Lenten season will truly bring you deeper into relationship with our Lord who so desires to be more in your daily life. Here are some steps to embrace as we begin Lent 2018 on Ash Wednesday, Feb 14.

- Make attendance at Worship a priority as much as your schedule allows (this might involve saying No to other opportunities that take you away from Worship.)
- Commit to reading the 40 day devotional "Sailing with the Spirit" available in the Welcome Center at the Ash Wednesday service.
- Join a Lenten small group (see Pastor Dan's article)
- Pray each day with the question, "What does God want our church to be doing now?"
- Serve our community in an intentional way during those 40 days; how does it feel to build the Kingdom of God?
- Engage in conversation with a child or youth who attends Westminster. Let them know that they matter to you as a member of our faith community.
- Appreciate the beauty of our Lenten Wednesday concerts which begin Feb. 21 and invite someone to attend with you.
- Look ahead to Holy Week and plan on attending the Maundy Thursday (March 29) and Good Friday (March 30) services. It will so enrich your Easter morning Worship to have had those worship experiences.

Make this journey a personal one, and yet don't forget that you are a part of a vibrant, healthy church and the church is stronger when your heart acknowledges God has put a new spirit in you.

February is the shortest month of the year. Make each day count as you grow as a disciple of Christ.

Great thanks to all who attended the annual meeting last Sunday and please be in prayer for our youth director search committee as they begin their hard work this month. We are so thankful for Scott's years of service with us and we'll be celebrating his huge impact for God on all of us as we plan for the transition at the end of summer.






Adult Education Opportunities

The Bible Tells Me So

In February and March during Adult Sunday School we will be looking at an increasingly important question... How should we read the Bible? Quite frankly, to be a church in this day and age, this is a question we have got to talk about.

So, this Lent I invite you to join me in watching video interviews with Peter Enns on topics found in his book, The Bible Tells Me So, and engage in meaningful conversation about the difficulties of the scriptures we love. For more info here is a synopsis of the study....



What if the Bible doesn't need to be protected and defended, but understood-just as it is? What if the real problem isn't the Bible but the false expectations we sometimes bring to it? Perhaps, when we let the Bible be the Bible rather than what we expect it ought to be-or need it to be-we will find a deeper faith in the process.
