Westminster Messenger – July, 2018 With Christ as our Cornerstone we Believe, Become, Belong, Build

From July 8 - August 19, we will be taking a look at the 10 commandments (Ex. 19-20) alongside the Sermon on the Mount (found in Matthew 5-7). And you may have never noticed before (I didn't, until someone told me), but the juxtaposition of these too texts is really fascinating because in Matthew's gospel, Jesus is presented as a new Moses. Consider just a few of the details of their stories. Both are survivors of child genocide, spent time in Egypt, were tempted in the wilderness, led people to a divine place (promised Land and Kingdom of Heaven), and went up a Mountain to reveal the law of God.

But, there are differences too. Matthew isn't trying to say that Jesus is replacing Moses. Instead, it seems like he is telling us that Jesus is finishing, or at least, continuing the work Moses began. Just look at Matthew 5:17, where Jesus tells us, "Don't even begin to think that I have come to do away with the Law and the Prophets. I haven't come to do away with them but to fulfill them." In other words, Jesus wasn't doing a brand new thing, he was taking the old thing and completing it. Moses began it by listening to God and delivering God's laws/teachings/instruction to the people. And Jesus, through his words and life...

interpreted the law,

embodied those teachings,

and showed us what it looks like to follow them with our daily lives.

Now a history lesson.

During the time of Jesus' ministry, no one had copies of scriptures in their homes (I know, sad). Yet, they probably knew them better than we do (sad in a different way). Why? Because it was part of their education system for one. But also, because they would gather every Sabbath, read the scrolls they did have in their worship spaces, and then talk about them. That's right, instead of one person with a degree and fancy robe going on and on about how to interpret the passages, the people gathered would share their opinions about what this meant for them in their time and in their lives. If, during these conversations you said something that was really off base, someone might accuse you of abolishing (or erasing or changing) the law. But if you said something spot on, or something that really inspired others, or, someone felt like it spoke to the heart of the matter, they might reply, 'you have fulfilled the law.'

Matthew's gospel then, is trying to get us to see that Jesus shows us the kind of life the law is meant to inspire.

One more point.

At end of the Sermon on the Mount is this verse: When Jesus finished these words, the crowds were amazed at his teaching because he was teaching them like someone with authority and not like their legal experts (Mt. 7:28-29). If you were a legal expert (a learned person in the law), and you gave your opinion on a particular matter, it was expected that you would rely on a precedent from previously accepted interpretations. Think of Supreme Courts cases where judges do the same thing. But here, the text tells us that Jesus uses no precedent. Rather, he speaks perfectly about the law, and he does so with his own authority. With his own insight. With his own ideas of what God is saying to us. And it is fulfilling.

So, my hope is that as we worship together over the next month and half, we can look once again at these ancient top 10 list of laws, hear what insights Jesus gives us about them, and maybe even share our own thoughts together about what it looks like to follow them today. Come, let us continue the conversation.
