I Thessalonians 1:2-3

Adult Education Sunday School

We will conclude our series on the three kinds of prayer with the following class by Juli Rowell in the Chapel.

Nov. 4 - The Welcoming Prayer is a method of consenting to God's presence and action in our physical and emotional reactions to events in our daily lives. As in all contemplative practices the purpose is to deepen our relationship with God. The fruit of the practice is a dismantling of the emotional programs of the false self system and the healing of our woundedness. We are thus able to respond rather than react to what life brings us. The Welcoming Prayer utilizes both interior and exterior factors in the process of our transformation in Christ.



A Thin Place

In July of 2018, Pastor Tricia had the opportunity to visit an island off the western coast of Scotland, Iona. Iona has much history which leads it to be called a thin place. This doesn't refer to the diet experienced there, but rather the deep spirituality that is experienced there.

George Macleod, founder of the Iona Community, wrote that Iona is "a thin place where only tissue paper separates the material from the spiritual."
