John 20:11-14

"Now Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot."

They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?"

"They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him."

Imagine the range of emotions that Mary must have felt when she arrived at the tomb after the death of Jesus. She goes to the tomb that day with the intention of grieving this deep loss of her friend, her teacher and her Savior and instead she encounters two angels. 

In March we continue looking at an increasingly important question... How should we read the Bible? Violence, genocide, racism, women's rights, slavery, and human sexuality have lead more and more to find the Bible difficult to read, and sometimes worse, devoid of value. Quite frankly, to be a church in this day and age, this is a question we have got to talk about.

So, this Lent I invite you to join me in watching video interviews with Peter Enns on topics found in his book, *The Bible Tells Me So*, and engage in meaningful conversation about the difficulties of the scriptures we love. For more info here is a synopsis of the study....




What if the Bible is fine just the way it is? Not a well behaved Bible, where everything lines up and makes sense, but the messy, troubling, and weird Bible we actually have? Perhaps, when we let the Bible be the Bible rather than what we expect it ought to be-or need it to be-we will find a deeper faith in the process.
