You can finally stop asking when the Transitional Pastor will arrive, because I'm excited to announce Pastor Ken Locke is here!!! I know that the Session, staff, pastor search committee, and many others have been anxiously awaiting his arrival, and I hope all of you join us in extending a warm greeting to Pastor Ken when you get the chance.



I wanted to take this opportunity to simply thank you for allowing me to serve as the temporary head of staff for the last 7 months. I am grateful for your trust in me and your support during this tumultuous year. The grace that has been

extended to me and words of encouragement have meant more than you know. Though the year was filled with many trials, it has also been one of the great joys in my pastoral ministry to witness the staff and volunteers of this church meet every obstacle and keep doing the Lord's work. I've been humbled to see your faithfulness through this time, and it is an honor to be your pastor.

For some, this may feel a bit strange to now have three leading pastors in the last year. But, in light of the coming holy day of Pentecost (where we celebrate the gift of God's Spirit given to the church), it feels an apt time to remind ourselves that in one way, really the most important way, the church leadership is not really changing. In fact, it never has. It has always been God who guides and directs our paths.

Interestingly, in one of the very first churches, people began to segment because they had a tendency to like one leader over another. The Apostle Paul thought this was ridiculous, because even though leaders have their part to play, it really isn't them doing the most important work. It's God.

## Here's how Paul puts it:

<sup>4</sup>When someone says, "I belong to Paul," and someone else says, "I belong to Apollos," aren't you acting like people without the Spirit? <sup>5</sup> After all, what is Apollos? What is Paul? They are servants who helped you to believe. Each one had a role given to them by the Lord: <sup>6</sup> I planted, Apollos watered, but God made it grow. <sup>7</sup> Because of this, neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but the only one who is anything is God who makes it grow. (1 Corinthians 3:4-7, <u>CEB).</u>

After all, What is Tricia? What is Dan? What is Ken? They are merely servants with roles to play. And thank the Lord for their dedication to doing good work. But on Pentecost, let us remember the one who is anything is God. The one who has given us the Spirit, and who makes things grow.

May this give you reassurance. May this give you hope.

#### **Nest Program**

The Mission Committee is once again supporting the Nest Program, which is a part of Operation Threshold and serves Black Hawk, Buchanan, and Grundy counties. It exists to educate income-eligible expectant families and families with children up to 5 years of age, with the goal of

increasing parenting skills and promoting the development of secure nurturing families and healthy children. Group parent education and informal support are the key program components. Classes offer education on topics such as healthy pregnancy outcomes, child abuse prevention, overall health and nutrition, literacy, fitness, family resources, mental wellness, and safety. Families also may earn points for healthy behavior during pregnancy and baby's first five years of life.

#### How Nest Works

Enrolled families can earn points by attending Nest classes, groups and activities. Points are also earned by signing up for and attending prenatal care, participating in 1:1 parent education, participating in the WIC program and attending WIC appointments, taking children for well child checks, immunizations and dental visits. Each activity is assigned a number of points that may be earned (from 10-50) which may be combined and used to "purchase" baby or child care items.

#### How Can We Help?

Donations of diapers, wipes, pull-ups, child underwear, baby wash/shampoo, baby lotion, diaper rash cream or baby items of your choice are needed to supplement items the parent(s) may earn.

During the month of May a table will be set up in the Welcome Center for your gifts. If you prefer to make a monetary donation a check made out to **Operation Threshold** (with "**Nest**" on the memo line) can be dropped in the offering plate or to the church office.

- old white bed sheets




## Summer Camp

## **Presbyterian Pantry**

The pantry is open on the first Saturday of the month and the 3rd Thursday. We are always needing volunteers to help pass out food on these days but we also need help pre-packing the food the day or two prior. You can call the church office at 234-5501 if you want to come in and help pack. Go to <u>wpcw.org/volunteer</u> to help when the pantry is open.

We have distributed food boxes to 204 individual households to date. We are averaging 50-60 per opening.
