Elder's Seeking Wisdom News Brief

In a special Session meeting on June 28, Session approved hiring a part-time Music Director, a Contemporary Worship Leader, and Handbell Director. A vacancy in music and strong congregational support for cuts to music expenses based on feedback from the congregation following the June 6 congregational meeting suggest music is a good target for budget and personnel cuts.

This proposal solves two problems: a projected budget shortfall and staffing vacancies in music programming. Budget projections show a shortfall of approximately \$14,000 for the 2020 fiscal year. These cuts cover nearly all of the shortfalls, but not all.

From Pastor Ken

For a few weeks in July, I had the pleasure of facilitating the Women's Bible Study in their review of 1st Corinthians. Together, we explored some of Paul's words of wisdom to the small congregation in Corinth. We specifically noted that some of what Paul wrote was specific to his time and place. But some of it is universal and applies equally well to us, today.

One of Paul's greatest concerns was about worship. We don't know much about the worship services of Paul's day, but we believe that they were full and busy. There were lots of hymns and readings from the scriptures. Some people would prophecy and others would speak in tongues. It seemed that the more people that were involved the better the service!

Paul was fine with that. He was happy with a full and robust service. But he insisted that everything be

done in an orderly way. He did not want worship to be chaotic.

Partly, Paul was concerned that everyone should have a chance speak. He didn't want anyone talking on top of anyone else. Also, he believed that our God is an orderly God, not given to chaos. (Contrast this to the Greco-Roman gods who frequently caused chaos and the Babylonian gods who created the world after a divine brawl.)

But Paul's main concern was that strangers be able to understand and follow the service. This is a concern for us today. Have you ever been to worship services that left you confused and dazed, services where you had little idea of what was happening? Would an unchurched person in our services feel that way, too?

That's one of the reasons why I periodically remind us why our service is ordered the way it is. Not that there will necessarily be visitors that Sunday, but so that we can remember and explain it to our guests.

We begin our services with the Call to Worship, reminding ourselves we are here to worship God. Next, we confess that, both as individuals and as a body, we have sometimes failed to follow God well. We have sinned. Once we have that off our chests, we formally recognized that God loves us so much God freely forgives us. No penance or arduous pilgrimage required. By God's grace in Jesus Christ, we are forgiven and are peace with God and one another. Flush with grace, we extend God's peace to those around us.

Now, we are ready to hear the good news of how much God loves us. This comes from both our scripture lessons and the day's sermon.

Next, we respond to God's good news. We respond by observing the sacraments (baptism and communion), praying with and for the world, and sharing our offerings to further God's ministries.

Finally, with both a charge and a blessing ringing in our ears, we leave the church to go out into the mission field of the world. We carry God's goodness and love out with us, giving it freely to all and sundry until we can gather together again.

It's unrealistic to expect a totally unchurched person to walk into one of our services and know exactly what's happening and why. Every organization has some knowledge or does something that is unique to them and can only be learned by time and experience. But nevertheless, we want our seekers to find what they are looking for. The way we worship can make it easier to do that.

Thank you for helping us have orderly services where God is truly worshipped, and we learn how much God loves us. I believe that God is pleased with our worship. And I believe that Paul would be, as well.

Finance

Finance - Monthly Recap

For June Westminster received \$40,125 in pledges and revenue versus last year's \$37,861. Year-to-date, we show giving at \$287,979 or 43 percent of the budget receipts which is about \$45,102 behind last year, the majority of this decrease is due to lower collected pledges.

Total expenses stood at \$49,455 for the month versus \$49,211 last year. Year-to-date expenses are at \$264,499 or 40% of budget and lower than last year's \$330,745. As you remember current expenses for the music program are running lower than budget due to the open music director position, however the personnel and music/worship committees have posted transitional positions to gear up for the Fall.

From a historical view, revenues typically run lighter in the Summer months as people are on vacation and the Church pares back on services.

As a reminder, Westminster's budget for 2021 is \$665,681 which includes \$73,156 in reserves and \$77,710 in endowment support. 2020 budget was \$775,505.

How Can You Help?

Scrip

The Scrip tables are open this summer. Look for us on **August 1, 15 and 29**. Supporting this program supports Westminster's budget! You can also purchase cards in the church office during the week. Help give back to your church by purchasing Scrip cards before you run to the grocery store or fill up the tank. Great for those going off to college!

Presbyterian Pantry

The pantry is open on the 1st Saturday of the month and the 3rd Thursday. We are always needing volunteers to help pass out food on these days but we also need help pre-packing the food the day or two prior. You can call the church office at 234-5501 if you want to come in and help pack. Go to wpcw.org/volunteer to help when the pantry is open. We currently need 6 people to sign up for August 7.

We have distributed food boxes to 221 individual households in our first year! In July we served 51 and 47 households.
