Women Build for Habitat for Humanity

On Saturday, August 14, I was fortunate to participate in a Women's Build with Habitat for Humanity, helping build a new home. In addition to working on the home, we learned more about the organization and the variety of ways they assist families and revitalize our community. It was interesting to learn that the organization has a waitlist of more than 200 families who wish to enroll in their programs. Each applicant is carefully vetted, ensuring that their debt-to-income ratio meets the standards set by Habitat for Humanity to qualify for a home loan. If approved for Habitat for Humanity's zero interest home loan

and prior to taking ownership of their home, the new homeowner must also complete 300 hours of service usually helping to build other homes, their home, and serving with other community organizations. In addition to providing interest free loans to qualified families and helping with the construction, Habitat for Humanity also provides home improvement workshops to educate new homeowners how to make small repairs to their homes, maintaining the initial beauty.

Habitat for Humanity not only build new homes, they also work to restore and remodel homes, keeping the original character and charm within the neighborhood alive and well. We were fortunate to tour some of these revitalized homes and were astonished by their beauty. We also learned that Habitat for Humanity provides micro-grants for families to implement a project that enhances their community. Some past grant winners used the money to plant flowers on the corners of the street, made wreaths for neighbors, and pulled together kids in the neighborhood to paint yard signs for all of their neighbors. Our Habitat Leader mentioned that these micro-grants are a great way to allow the neighbors to come together, bond, and support one another. They have also noticed, as they work to restore and build habitat homes, other homeowners in the neighborhood are inspired to enhance their own homes, further revitalizing the neighborhoods.

As for the build itself, it was wonderful serving with friends and learning new skills. We installed a window, cut and installed soffit, and placed shingle caps on the roof. It was a day full of hard work, laughter, and only a couple of nails were dropped.. yeah, only a couple. We are already looking forward to the next build, hopefully you can join next time, too!

From Pastor Ken

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." Romans 12:2, NRSV

As many of you know, I did not come to Presbyterianism until I was in my 30s. My previous denomination was becoming increasingly doctrinaire and frowned on anything outside of a very narrow orthodoxy. It certainly frowned on my penchant for asking questions. Part of what attracted me to our denomination was its openness to new ideas and to my questions.

Asking questions is an important part of growing and learning anything. Sure, someone can tell us what to think and do and believe, but that's always going to be 'head' knowledge, not 'heart' knowledge. Only by asking questions and puzzling over answers can we acquire a deep, visceral, 'heart' knowledge of anything – be it love, baseball or God.

As Christians, learning about God is at the center of our faith. As Christians, we know the greatest and most joyful life comes from living like God. Our greatest and most joyful life comes from loving and caring for others the way God does. The more we ask questions about God, the more we share our questions with others and learn together, the more we know about God. The more we know about God, the more we can become like God and the more joyful and fulfilling our lives will be.

That is why I am so glad that our Christian Education ministry is resuming this month. Once again, we will be able to gather together (Covid willing, if not then some other way) to share our questions and concerns, learn from each other, care for each other and grow in faith together.

Furthermore, growing in faith does not just benefit us as individuals. It benefits our church as well. As more and more of us grow in faith and learn how to please God, the more our ministries will align themselves with God's desires for us. That will make us a stronger, more viable, more Christ-centered church.

I encourage all of us, from the oldest to the youngest, to come together to learn and grow in faith. Individual, daily Bible study is important but reading our Bibles by ourselves doesn't let us hear our friend's perspective and it doesn't let us help answer our friend's questions. Worshipping together is important, but only doing so 2 or 3 times a month is going to leave us spiritually hungry.

Please, come and find a Sunday School class. Come and find a Bible study. Come and bring your questions and your new ideas to a place and a people who know their importance to our spiritual renewal. Come and help us all, as individuals and as a church, grow in faith and ministry together.

Finance

Finance - Monthly Recap

For July Westminster received \$49,589 in pledges and revenue versus last year's \$69,425. Last year's July figure included a \$32,000 subsidy from the Endowment. Year-to-date, we show giving at \$337,570 or 51 % of the budgeted receipts which is about \$63,710 behind last year, the majority of this decrease is due to lower collected pledges and the afore mentioned Endowment transfer.

Total expenses stood at \$48,575 for the month versus \$56,565 last year. Year-to-date expenses were \$313,074 or 47% of budget and lower than last year's \$387,311. As you remember current expenses for the music program are running lower than budget due to the open music director position, however the personnel and music/worship committees have plans in place to gear up for the Fall.

From a historical view, revenues typically run lighter in the Summer months as people are on vacation and the Church pares back on services.

As a reminder, Westminster's budget for 2021 is \$665,681 which includes \$73,156 in reserves and \$77,710 in endowment support. 2020 budget was \$775,505.

Scrip
