The Blessing Finalists

Below is a synopsis of each of the three community organizations the Mission Committee has selected to be considered for this year's Blessing. **Voting will be in person at both services on Sunday, Dec. 4**, with the results being announced at the single service at 10am on Sunday, December 11. Hospitality House of the Cedar Valley

Hospitality House of the Cedar Valley is a daytime homeless shelter in the Cedar Valley providing shelter, meals, showers and laundry, clothing, social advocacy and more to those who are in a homeless situation. The Warming Center provides overnight shelter to those who are not otherwise shelter appropriate giving them a safe and warm place to be nightly from January through March. They provide cots, sleeping bags, blankets, mats, pillows and a to-go meal for each guest. The \$7,000 blessing would be used for general expenses for the Warming Center including Peer Support. Hospitality House has 20 regular volunteers and 3 peer support. The organization is about making sure that everyone has a place to be that is warm, safe and secure. They provide for the homeless and marginalized.

Cedar Valley Angels

Cedar Valley Angels is an organization in Waterloo whose mission is to walk alongside children, youth and families in the foster care community. They do this by offering consistent support through intentional giving, relationship building and mentorship. The Love Box program matches local families with volunteers based on location, compatibility and scope of needs. Those volunteers show up monthly to support parents and children. The Dare to Dream program provides 1:1 mentorship to youth in care who are 11-22 years of age. The \$7,000 blessing would be used for additional funds within the Love Box and Dare to Dream programs. This funding

would allow for volunteers to partner with case managers to meet needs for families such as meals, registration for extra curriculars, educational materials, household needs, birthday/holiday items and much more. It can also be spent for community education and events for the families that Cedar Valley Angels serves as well as educational opportunities for the staff. Cedar Valley Angels has 5 full-time employees, 1 paid intern, and 55 regular volunteers.

The Job Foundation

The Job Foundation is an organization in Cedar Falls that works to provide financial literacy to kids in low-income families. They work with children and provide financial incentive to kids by tying earnings to good grades, behaviors, and attendance at school. 60% of earnings must be held in savings and are able to be accessed when a student graduates high school with no criminal record. The other 40% may be spent during supervised shopping trips that provide hands on learning of budgeting, comparison shopping, balancing checkbooks, giving charitably, providing for their families, and much more. The Job Foundation also provides financial stewardship classes. The Job Foundation would use the \$7,000 blessing to support the conditional cash earnings component of The Job Foundation's program. These earnings are tied to securing financial stability for children growing up in low-income households with the goal of a student having at least \$3,400 in their savings account at graduation to help launch them into independent living with the tools and knowledge to manage their funds.

From the Heart

For the older kids (10 years old and up), we will be giving them a \$25 gift Scrip card. We will collect money for this, so if you would like to help in that way, you can let them know at the table, or drop off a check.
